Message from Dickens Fellowship President, Emeritus Professor Catherine Waters:

As President of the Dickens Fellowship and an inhabitant of what I like to think of as my own bit of the Great Expectations country on the north Kent marshes, I am delighted that our 2023 international conference will take place in another setting from that novel: Barnard's Inn, Holborn. Formerly one of the Inns of Chancery, it is the perfect location for a conference on the theme of 'Dickens, Law and Disorder'.

Barnard's Inn was home to Pip, who took up lodgings there with Herbert Pocket upon his arrival in London in the second chapter of the second stage of his Great Expectations. He found it to be 'the dingiest collection of shabby buildings ever squeezed together in a rank corner as a club for tom-cats'. Pip's extended description of its 'dismal' aspect is a masterpiece of the comic grotesque. These days, however, Barnard's Inn is a much more salubrious spot as home to Gresham College, an institution of higher learning especially renowned for its programme of public lectures.

As we gather in person for the first time since 2019, I look forward to meeting and talking with members and exploring Dickens's rich and paradoxical engagement with the law, order and disorder.

The price of the Garrick Club banquet is £100


The price of the Gad's Hill/Rochester trip is £35


